


Reflections of Life

Arthur Press Pendleton, Jr., was a devoted husband, a loving father and brother, a kind grandfather, and a trusting friend. Arthur Press was born February 24, 1948, in Hazlehurst, Copiah County, Mississippi to the late Mr. Arthur Press, Sr. and Mrs. Bessie Mae Reese Pendleton.

Arthur Press, affectionately known as "Press Pendleton and Peabody" to his family, friends and co-workers, transitioned from his earthly life on Monday, September 16, 2024, at his home. Arthur Press received his formal education at St. Morris School and the Hazlehurst City School District. He was a member of Parrish High School Class of 1969.


To Our Brother
