
Celebrating the Life of Mrs. Eliza Rhodes

On January 26, 1921, Dan and Daisy Craft Jones welcomed their daughter Eliza, the sixth of eight children into the world in Hazlehurst, Mississippi. Having been born during a time where resources were scarce for everyone, Eliza learned the value of practicing wise stewardship. It was a lesson that shaped how she worked, what she spent, and what she saved. Eliza's parents taught her the value of hard work and getting an education. She received her early education at Antioch School and then transitioned to Parrish High School. Eliza's parents also instilled in her that all these things are meaningless without a relationship with the Lord. She accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in Hazlehurst, Mississippi, where she was a faithful member, in the choir, and in the Women Auxiliary until she was no longer physically able to do so. At the time of her transition, she was Antioch's oldest living member.

Eliza's life teaches us that the more important things in life cannot be quantified with tangible things. She had a green thumb to make anything grow and often cooked what she grew. She placed value on being prudent, not being wasteful, exercising wisdom, and saying what she meant.

In her late teens, Eliza's life changed. During a trip to town, she saw a dress that captured her eye. As she was admiring the dress, a gentleman named Marion was admiring her and eventually approached her and asked her on a date. Never at a loss for words or being one to mince words, Eliza told him that if he bought her the dress, she would go out with him. So, as destiny would have it, he bought her the dress. The two celebrated 39 years of marriage until Marion made his transition to be with the Lord. Eliza never remarried and now 39 years later, she too is with the Lord. She was preceded in death by their son, Norman Ellis Rhodes, step-sons Marion Rhodes, Jr. and Julius Rhodes, and her siblings: Emerson Jones, Ardell Jones, Robert T. Jones, Ellis Jones, Clara Jones, Mabel Jones Marshall, Dorthene Jones Ramsey, and Bernice Johnson.

Eliza is survived by her children: Carroll Rhodes, Sr. (Linda); Paul Anthony Rhodes (Tony); a host of grandchildren; great-grandchildren; nieces; nephews; cousins; friends; a special first cousin Thelma Eason; special "adopted" daughter Felecia Major (Jeff); special friend, Corrine Anderson; and the Antioch M.B. Church Family.

& bright and sunny days.


I'd like the tears of those who grieve,
