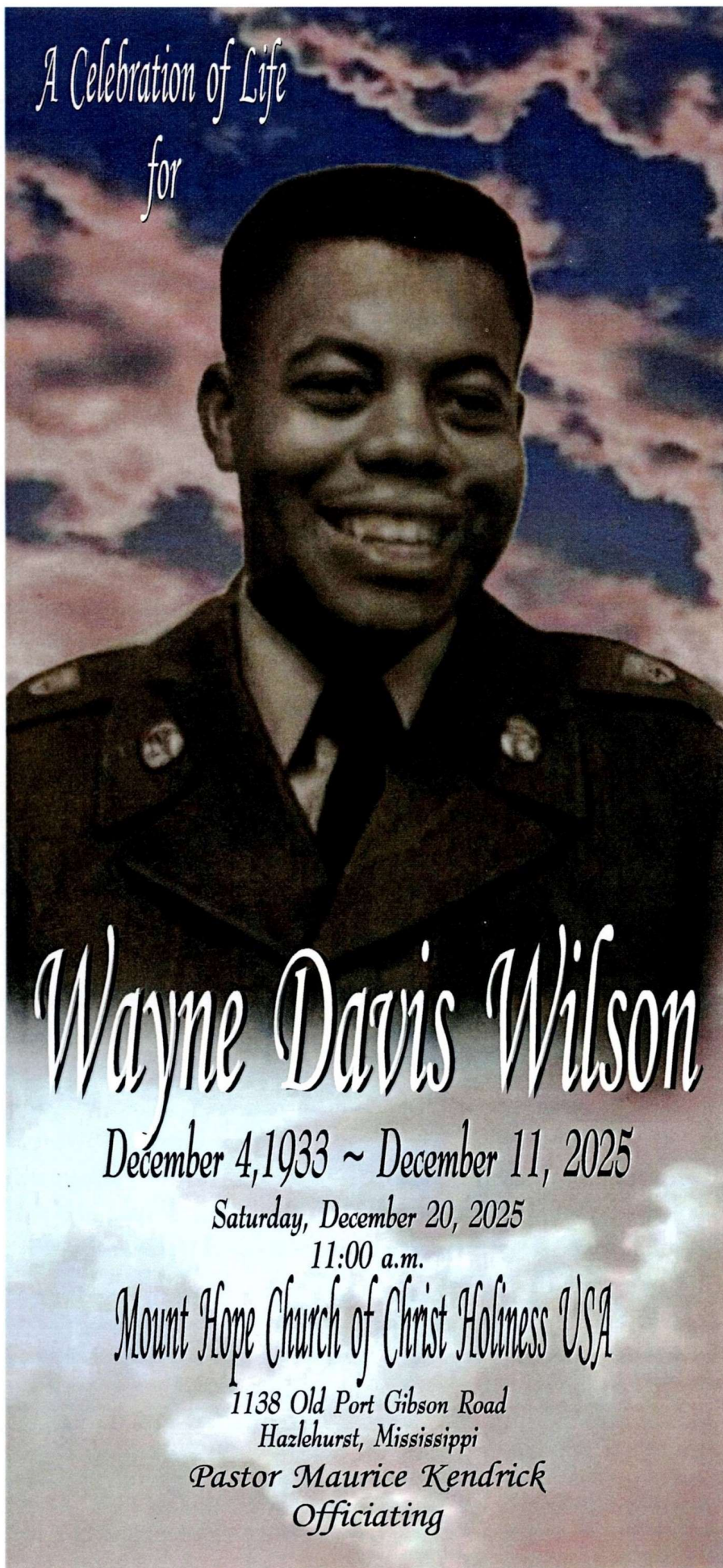

and he was loved so much.*

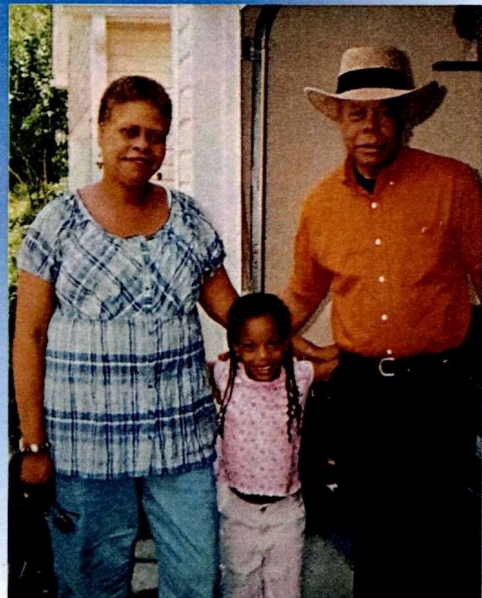
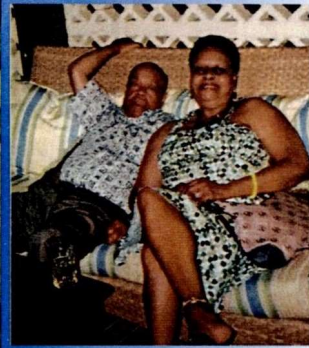
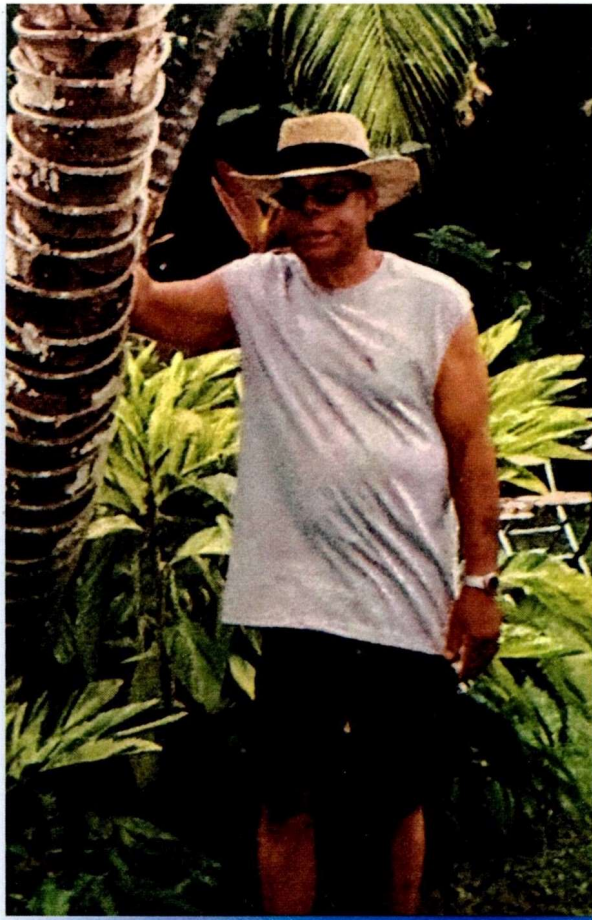
